This approach has brought many successes in terms of new business, and we estimate that companies supported by LJMU turnover at least £20M per year.




Sharon Munroe graduated with a BA in Health Studies from the LJMU School of Public Health in 2013. Soon after, she set up Equilibrium

They opened their first premises with Picnic Liverpool Smithdown Ltd in 2020 and expanded in 2023, opening a new restaurant in West Derby. Since opening, PICNIC has seen support from the local community, with Uber Eats awarding the business as the North West's best restaurant of the year in 2022 and shortlisting them again in 2023.

In addition to their freelance work, Lo also runs art workshops like the popular 'Drink and Draw', which recently received coverage on Radio Merseyside.




